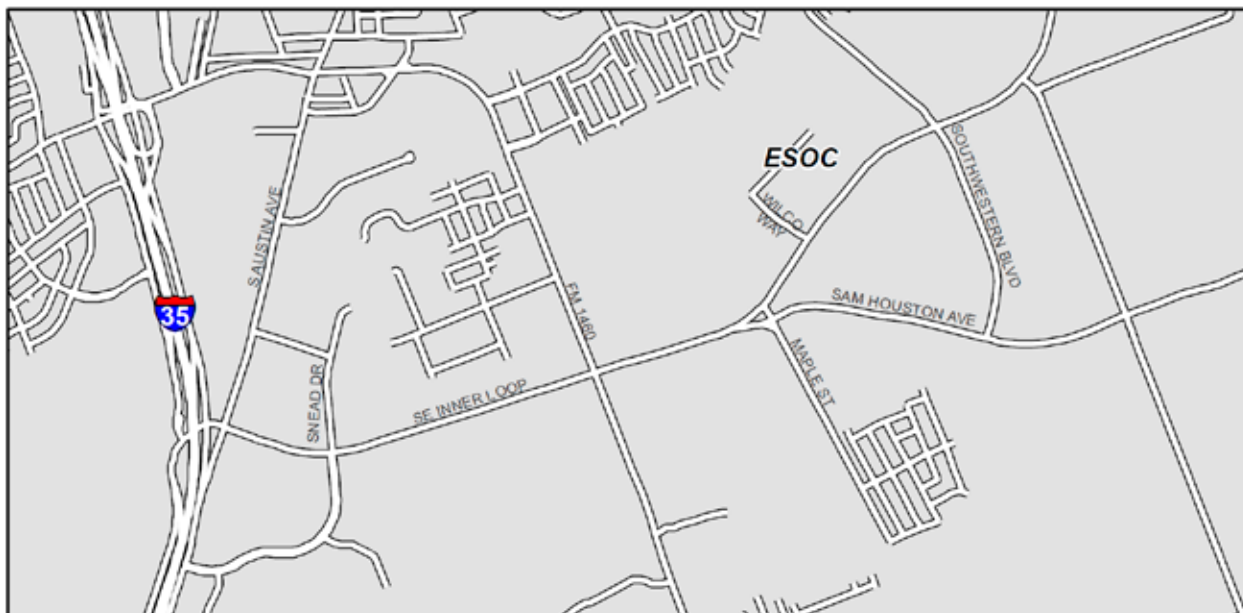
Take IH-35 Northbound

ESOC is ahead on the right

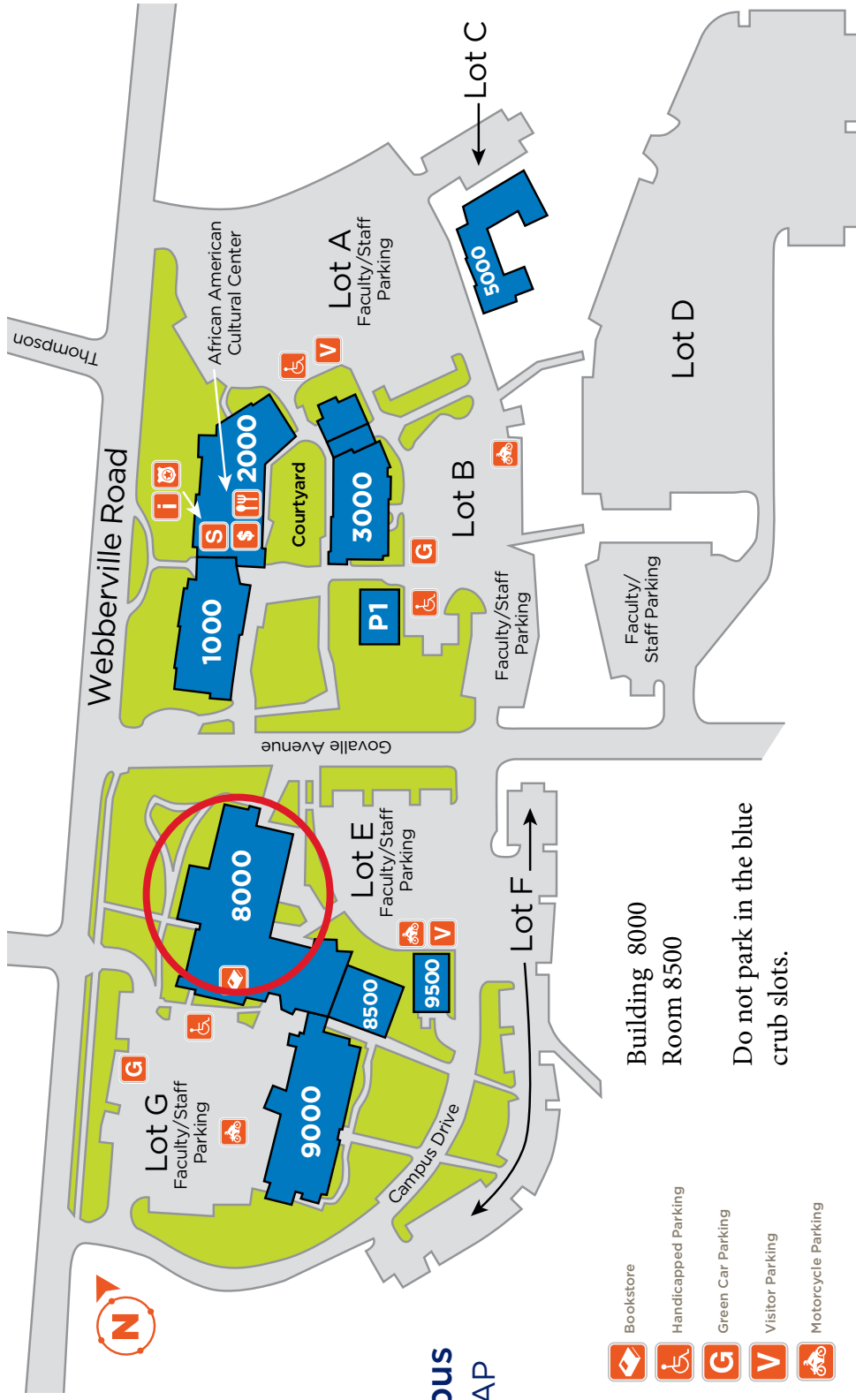
From North (Georgetown, Jarrell)

Stay on Inner Loop for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile
Turn left on Wilco Way (at the top of the hill)
Turn right on Tracy Chambers Ln
